



Panel Discussion - Key Takeaways

- PC and Therapist Rule/out process to accept a case involving PCCPs. When do we say yes and when do we say no to a referral?
- How to use a Team model of providers, led by a PC for Severe Resist/Refuse cases.
- Team meetings between providers on team to collaborate on treatment goals and barriers to treatment.
- The PC supports the therapeutic team, oversees treatment goal progress, barriers and provides accountability, monitoring, and strong recommendations, backed by the Court, when necessary.
- The use of measurement tools (CRDC, Continuum of Intervention) to guide the PCCP intervention, measure progress and establish treatment goals.
- Attorneys are an important part of the team and need to work together to support the PC and providers to achieve positive outcomes for these children and families. Litigation drives up conflict and decreases the likelihood of a successful outcome
- The importance of all providers on a team to commit to AFCC Guidelines for court-involved therapists.
- Set realistic expectations for everyone involved. It is rare there are fairytale endings in cases with moderate—severe PCCP's.
